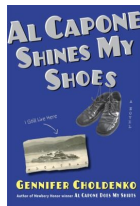

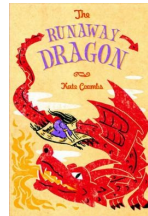
**Gennifer Choldenko— *Al Capone Shines My Shoes***

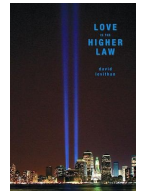
**Kate Coombs— *The Runaway Dragon***

 Five troubled teenagers fall into prostitution as they search for freedom, safety, community, family, and love.



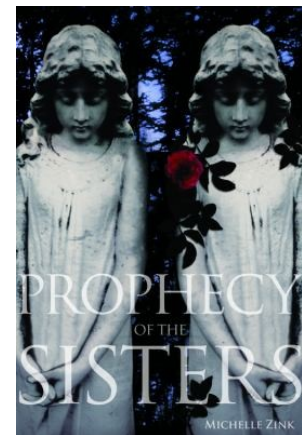
**David Levithan— *Love is the Higher Law***
