### Organizational History

Before the first Baptist Church and Society in Haverhill, Massachusetts, was formed, a young minister, Hezekiah Smith, visited the town on 27 July 1764 and preached in the West Parish. He had recently graduated from Princeton College, in New Jersey and had been ordained as a Baptist minister in Charleston, South Carolina. The church in the West Parish of Haverhill was without a pastor and Smith was persuaded to preach again in the West Parish on 15 August 1764. On 22 October, Smith started on a journey to visit his relatives in new Jersey. Several of the prominent citizens in Haverhill tried to secure his services as a permanent minister among them, and he promised to return. Early in December, Smith returned to Haverhill.

On New Year's Day, 1765, a group of citizens gathered in the home of James Duncan (1725-1817) to organize the Baptist Religious Society in Haverhill. This included members of the White family, the Ayer family, the Whittier family, the Chase family, and others. Because there was no recognized Baptist Church in the immediate vicinity at that time, the people in Haverhill were on their own; and, so, on the ninth of May, 1765, seven brethren and sixteen sisters, "after solemn fasting and prayer, mutually agreed to walk in gospel order together, having been first baptized by immersion, but not joined to any church." With one exception these people had all been baptized by Mr. Smith.

On the 28th of June 1765, the Haverhill church gave Smith a call to become their pastor. This call does not appear to have been either accepted or declined until August 22nd, 1766, when Smith was received into membership with the church, by letter from the Baptist church in Charleston, South Carolina. The call was then renewed, and on the 12th of November 1766, Mr. Smith was installed as the pastor of the church and continued in that office until his death. The Baptist Religious Society in Haverhill was incorporated by the Massachusetts Legislature on 18 February 1793 with an act of incorporation signed by Governor John Hancock.

All of the other congregations in Haverhill refused to let the Baptists use any of the town's meeting houses during off-hours, so the Baptists met under Mr. Colby's roof until they could start to meet in the shell of their own meeting house. Fifty-two people contributed \$1,135, to build their own place of worship. The frame of the first meeting-house was raised on 5 and 6 June 1765. Located on Merrimack Street, between How and Pecker Streets on a steep hill, it was first built without a steeple; one was added in 1799. The second meeting house was built in 1833 on the same site and dedicated on 7 November 1833. The cost was \$5,300. The congregation outgrew this building, so a third meeting house was built in 1849 for \$17,000 and dedicated on 8 November 1849. In 1882, it was decided to purchase land on Main Street and build a bigger church. This created a debt which was finally paid off in 1913. The new building was dedicated on 22 November 1883.

The church is still active in 2021.

## Scope and Content Note

The First Baptist Church of Haverhill records document the activities, memberships, financial transactions, pastoral activities, and social activities of the church in the 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. It has been organized into six series. Series one contains administrative material such as record books, correspondence, the act of incorporation, the articles of faith, the covenant, a handbook, a manual, legal documents, meeting minutes, a membership card, an annual report, a directory, a brochure, and specifications for the organ. Series two contains financial records including bills, receipts, accounts, subscriptions, tax collection information, a book of pew deeds, account books, reports, documents for building the three meeting houses, correspondence, a fundraising brochure, and a quote for a building. Series three contains ministers' papers, calendars, programs, and membership information. Of interest is an 1843 letter from David P. Harmon resigning his membership because he felt the church did not condemn slavery. Series four contains a list of subscribers and programs for the Sabbath School (also called Bible School). Series five contains records of the societies or clubs that were part of the church. It consists of eight subseries, arranged in the order the groups were founded. Series six contains news clippings, a handwritten Bible verse, articles, a memoir, photographs, a poem, and several hymns.
