<b>Abstract:</b>	The Eclectic Club records document the activities and administration of this women's literary and social organization from 1900 to 1975.

### **Organizational History**

The Eclectic Club was a women's club founded in 1896 for the "mutual benefit of its members and advancement in the knowledge of general literature." Seven of the 18 charter members lived on or adjacent to Salem Street, Bradford, Massachusetts. When their husbands were occupied in the evenings, the ladies would sit with their neighbors, knitting and discussing the latest books and matters in general. Because they all felt the need of the development of the mind and the general study of literature, the idea of a club was born.

On 6 November 1896, a meeting was called at the home of Jane Wood, where it was voted to organize a literary club with Jane as the first president and Alice Kelley as secretary and treasurer. Later a vice-president was chosen. They selected the mountain laurel as the club flower; the club colors were pink and green. Cora Belle Sanborn came up with the name for the club and it was immediately accepted. At first, the first meetings were held on Saturday evenings from 7:45 to 10:00, but later were changed to Monday afternoons fortnightly. The members presented papers on an annual theme (e.g. Russia, Scandinavia, etc.) and there were social meetings and outings. Dues were 25 cents to start and later raised.

In the minutes of 5 May 1975, the assistant secretary wrote, "No regular meetings were scheduled for the future. The meeting closed with the hope that some understanding would be reached as to the future of the Eclectic Club." It is not known if or when the club disbanded.
