Abstract:	The North Parish Church and North Parish Community Church (Haverhill, Mass. and Plaistow, N.H.) records document the activities, memberships, financial transactions, pastoral activities, and social activities of the church in the 18 th , 19 th , and 20 th centuries.

Organizational History

The town of Haverhill, Massachusetts, was separated into multiple parishes during the early eighteenth century. In 1728, the town was divided into two parishes with the formation of the North Parish. In 1729, the first meeting house for the North Parish was completed. In 1731, a committee was formed to build a parsonage house and barn. Title to this property was voted to Rev. Gyles Merrill on 15 October 1770.

In 1741, the New Hampshire/Massachusetts state line was run, dividing the parsonage. The General court decided that the portion south of the line should be the North Parish of Haverhill. The North Parish was transferred to Plaistow, New Hampshire in 1741 and the Rockingham Congregational Church was formed. During the first part of the nineteenth century, doctrinal differences arose. In July 1823, the parish petitioned the General Court for power to sell the parsonage lands to form a Ministerial Fund. The sale provided the basis of the present fund.

During the ministry of Samuel H. Peckham, 1831-1838, the difficulties caused by the running of the state line ended in the permanent division of the North Parish and the Plaistow

Congregational Society. On 22 April 1871, three men were selected to choose a location for a new church building. Delays arose over the management of parish funds, resulting in litigation which delayed matters until 23 April, 1878, when another committee was given power to purchase land and erect a church. The first parish meeting in the new church was held on 15 October 1879, and the building was dedicated on 23 September 1880.

During the ministry of H. S. Hawver, 1924-1926, the Plaistow Society joined the North Parish of Haverhill. Evening services were held in the North Parish church and congregants began to want a definite joining of forces. In 1928, under the ministry of Forrest R. Brown, a federation was formed to be known as the North Parish Community Church. New parish by-laws were written by a committee and the church was thoroughly remodeled and redecorated. Services began in 1929.

In 1940, the Centre Congregational Church and North Congregational Church merged to form the First Congregational Church in Haverhill which occupied the North Church building. In 1963, the North Parish Community Church merged into the First Congregational Church; at the same time the First Congregational Church joined the United Church of Christ. In 2010 the 1860 church building was sold and the First Congregational Church was formally dissolved.

Scope and Content Note

The North Parish Church and North Parish Community Church (Haverhill, Mass. and Plaistow, N.H.) records document the activities, memberships, financial transactions, pastoral activities, and social activities of the church in the 18th, 19th, and 20th centuries. The collection has been arranged into six series. Series one contains record books and documents relating to the dispute over Rev. Samuel H. Series two contains financial records such as ledgers and record books, subscriptions, receipts, donations, deeds, bequests, wills, and a pew plan. Series three contains a receipt, a program, a news clipping about one of the ministers, a list of baptisms, and a biography of one of the ministers. Series four consists of records of the societies or clubs that were part of the church, arranged chronologically. Sunday School is included in this series. Series five contains news clippings and several histories of the church. Series six contains records of the North Parish Community Church, arranged chronologically. It includes a yearbook, annual reports, correspondence, treasurer's reports, a ledger, meeting minutes, a program, two studies, and by laws.
