**Abstract:** The collection contains record books, calendars, letters,

photographs, and other records from the Papyrus Club of Haverhill, Massachusetts, a women's club that held regularly scheduled meetings to discuss history, culture, and literature.

# **Organizational History**

In March 1876, there was a meeting of the North Church Industrial Society at the home of Mary Johnson on Main Street, Haverhill, Massachusetts. Helen W. How, Mary Johnson, and several other women discussed starting a club for the sharing of knowledge. Miss Goodrich invited these ladies to meet at her home on March 27<sup>th</sup>. At this meeting, a committee was appointed to prepare a constitution and by-laws; elected a president, vice-president, a secretary/treasurer; and appointed a committee of three to decide upon topics for study. On Monday, 3 April 1876, the first regular meeting of the Papyrus Club was held at the home of Miss Annie Gilman, with all 14 members present. Its charter members listened to an anniversary ode and then drew up a constitution dedicating themselves (on a parchment scroll) to "mutual improvement." Meetings were held every Monday from April to October. After a member had read her paper, a discussion ensued. There were no refreshments served. The club flower was the pansy and the club color was lavender. The number of members was later increased to 16.

In the days when society held that formal education for women was not considered of great importance, the original members embarked upon a course of study of literature (beginning with Shakespeare), the history, culture, and economics of every major country of the time, the arts throughout the world and throughout history, as well as other topics. Each club year had its

main topic and each member had an assigned subject related to that topic. In 1900-1901, for example, the club studied Russia. Each year, they had at least one "outing," a trip to some place of interest.

The club worked to help found several organizations still active in the city: The Boys' Club; the Children's Aid Society; and the Haverhill Historical Society. They initiated local interest in having a children's librarian appointed to the public library staff.

By the 1950s, the Papyrus Club became more of a social club with monthly meetings and guest speakers or field trips. The membership grew to 19 and contributions were made to the Red Cross and the Community Chest. In 1971, they produced a cook book and gave all of the profits to the Haverhill Public Library. From a note in the records, the club dissolved in 2013.

Series one contains records kept by the secretary of the club and other administrative records such as the club's constitution and by-laws, lists of officers from the inception of the club, correspondence, and treasurer's account books. Series two contains annual calendars for the club's activities, including the topic for the season, a list of members, officers, hostesses, and sometimes references. Series three contains material created by club members including poetry, photographs, papers, news clippings, a scrapbook, the Cook Book they produced, and writings.
