What originally made you interested in reading/watching/playing this media? How did you hear about it or come across it?

I saw a lot of videos on MHA (My Hero Academia) online before I started watching it. I also have a favorite character whose storyline really drew me into watching the anime from start to finish.

Is it part of a series? If so, what series is it?

I think so! MHA itself is a series of Manga volumes, with the anime having eight season.

This media follows Izuku Midoriya, a quirkless boy, and his journey in becoming a hero and fighting the Symbol of Fear, Tomura Shigaraki. Shigaraki is apart of a group called the League of Villains (L.O.V.) and is under the guidance of All For One, the Symbol of Evil. Midoriya becomes All Might's successor in the first season and trained under him with his new quirk One For All. All Might is the Symbol of Peace and has been fighting All For One since he was given the baton to. Although I can't explain what the 'baton' is, it's super important! The anime follows through many funny moments, fighting moments, and ends in a full blown war between Heroes and Villains, in which one side comes into victory.

Who are the main characters? What makes them interesting or unique?

The main character is Izuku Midoriya. He's unique because he was born apart of the 20% of the population that was quirkless, or powerless. What makes him extra interesting is that he got a quirk as a teenager, but not through the way you'd expect. You'll have to watch the anime for that.

Does this media remind you of anything else you've read/watched/played?

As this is my first anime, no, it has not reminded me of anything I've seen before. Although, I have watched many videos about the anime prior to seeing it.
